## 2021 Family Advent Calendar of Opportunities

Have you ever picked up one of those fancy, cardboard Advent calendars from the grocery store and wondered what Advent is really all about? It couldn't just be about eating an extra 10 calories of chocolate each day in December, right? Well, for many Christian families, the Advent calendar serves as a tool to help keep their minds on the practice of waiting for the arrival of Jesus. This Family Advent Calendar of Opportunities is intended to provide inspiration for a daily activity that can coincide with the All Church Advent Series Overview, the Memory Verses and activities adapted from the Go! Sunday School Curriculum and service opportunities with our Missions Partners.

Unlike traditional calendars which assign an activity to a specific day counting down the days until Christmas Eve, this Advent Calendar of Activities offers 7 options weekly, underneath a new weekly theme. You can use any activity on any day of the week. Each Friday there is an invitation to attend a special event at the church. Feel free to skip activities that don't work with your schedule, or reuse an activity more than once if your family really enjoys it. We know that the holiday season is already jam-packed. The flexibility of this guide should help inspire you towards waiting and preparing for Christmas, a devotion that can become a natural part of your family rhythm. Use it over breakfast before school, at the dinner table, or around bedtime prayers. The Hymn of the Week can be accessed through our WCPC Spotify channel. Listen and be encouraged as you wash the dishes or commute to work. We hope that these opportunities to prepare for the coming of Christmas will bring your family into the joy of anticipating Jesus!

## **Advent Activity**

You will need:

## Pass the CANDY CANE





Scissors

**Candy Cane** 

Cut off the bible verse at the bottom of this page.

Begin the game by passing a candy cane around the table (like hot potato). As the candy cane is being passed, recite the Bible verse together and in unison from the card in the middle.

When the group has finished reading the verse, the person holding the candy cane can keep it.

Next, flip the Bible verse card over so that the verse is no longer visible. Whoever is holding the candy cane recites the verse from memory along with the kids sitting to their left and right. If the kid holding the candy cane successfully recites the verse, they can keep the candy cane. Otherwise, they have to give it back.

Either with a gingerbread person cookie, or using the coloring page below, decorate your cookie while creatively praying for God to provide in each way a person might be in need.



## Advent Activity

## THE GREAT *BIBLE*





You will need:



Tape/String

Paper Plates

Cut out the words on the last page of this packet. Use painters tape or string to create a starting line on the floor. Place the cut out words on a carpeted floor about 15 feet (4.5 meters) from the starting line. Give each player a set of paper plates to use as skates.

Have your child(ren) place one paper plate beneath each of their feet.

"Skate" to the words, pick one up and "skate" back to the tape line.

Continue "skating" until each card has been retrieved.

When all of the cards have been retrieved, race to assemble the cards in the order of today's verse: "Nothing is impossible with God."

Once the verse is in the right order, read it together several times until the kids have it memorized. Then, flip the cards over and have your group recite it from memory.

Is there a challenge you're facing now that seems impossible for you? What is it?

How do you think God might be able to help you through that challenge?


## Service Opportunities

Work together as a group to stack the cups in the shape of a pyramid.

Turn off the lights and try to build the pyramid again.

Now try it blindfolded!

## Advent Activity

HEADS OR

TAILS

You will need:



10 Coins

Divide the coins between your family (dividing evenly isn't neccessary).

On the count of 3, everyone flips their coins into the air. When they've landed, mark how many heads and tails you got.

Keep track of the highest number of heads or tails achieved (your high score). For example, one turn, 8 of 10 coins might land on heads.

Flip until the kid's see it's nearly impossible to all get the same side (or until they lose interest). When finished, ask the following questions:

Questions

What do you think the chances are that all the coins could land on the same side? How long do you think it would take to do it?

Jesus fulfills all 48 Old Testament prophecies about the Savior. He fits EXACTLY the description God gave of the Rescuer. What are the chances that Jesus could have done this by accident?

It's nearly impossible that Jesus could have accidently fulfilled all of the Old Testament prophecies. In fact, there's a much better chance that we could have all flipped our coins to the same side. There's only one explanation for that. Jesus IS the one that God spoke about through the prophets. That means that he is both Lord and Savior.
